



## Blowing our Horn!

In December 2009 the society launched its monthly e circular with a [brief discussion](#) about our pair of remarkable 18th century carved angels which once adorned the organ of the Dutch Reformed Church on Market Square. This month, we have seen them come full circle as the "face" of the Philadelphia Antiques Show, now adorning countless billboards, posters and magazine ads throughout the region and the country.

The society is extremely proud to be one of a small number of lenders featured in the Antiques Show loan exhibit, entitled *Celebrations: Antiques that Mark the Moment*. In addition to the angels, the society is loaning four significant pieces from our museum collections: a pair of cups commemorating the Marquis de Lafayette's visit to Philadelphia, an ophicleide and its painted box used by the Germantown Blues militia band, and *The Turk*, our fascinating connection to the [Grand Mischianza](#) that marked the end of the occupation of Philadelphia by the British in 1778. For the first time in known memory, *The Turk* will be displayed along with *The Grenadier* from the collections of the Philadelphia History Museum, the only other known surviving "dummy board" figure produced by John Andre for the Mischianza.
